Melwood is Coming!

Our spring weekends are close at hand and I want to pass on to Sponsors and the Community some of the important details concerning the weekends.

Directions; Melwood is located about 13 miles away from the intersection of Route 301 and Route 6 in La Plata. Go West on Route 6 approximately 11.5 miles. Turn left onto Route 425 and go approximately 2.5 miles. Melwood will be on the right. The sign at the entrance says Melwood in small letters, but has the name C **amp A-Kom-Plish** in large letters. See the picture of the sign and of the Rt. 6/Rt 425 intersection and the map of the site.

From points North of La Plata: Take Route 301 South to La Plata then right onto Route 6 West and follow the directions above.

From St. Mary County: Take Route 5 to Route 6 West to La Plata. Cross Route 301 and follow the directions above.

From points South of La Plata: Take Route 301 North to La Plata then left onto Route 6 West and follow the directions above.

Parking: If the weather is dry, we will be able to park in the field by the basketball court. We can park 8 or 10 cars by the dining hall, and 10 or 15 on the basketball court and some along the road. We **cannot** block the fire lane that loops around the lodges. If more parking is needed for candle light and closing we should park in the big lot by the entrance. . **Carpooling** will be very helpful because parking close to the center is limited.



"Brothers [and sisters], I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead. I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 3:13-14, NIV)

This has been one of my favorite verses in the Bible for a long, long time. I guess it helps me remember that I do need to forget my past failures and mistakes and keep pressing on toward God's purpose and call in my life. I don't know about you, but this is often difficult for me to do, especially when things don't turn out the way "I" expected them to turn out. I tend to dwell on my hurts and disappointments – that just makes me even more angry or upset, which is very unhealthy and can even lead to physical illness.

I often forget that God is there in the midst of those difficult times and that I can grow and learn through them. It is during difficult times that not only do I find out more about others, but, most importantly, I find out more about myself. No matter how hard I try, I know that I am not perfect . I hate to admit it, but I do make mistakes. Unfortunately and unintentionally, I know that I have hurt others by my words and actions. It really upsets me when I do this - I don't want to be the reason others are hurt. One of the most difficult things I have had to do is apologize for something wrong that I did to someone else. It was unintentional, so I didn't even realize that I had done it until the Holy Spirit convicted me - I will never ever forget that experience. It was difficult for me to admit my mistake and ask forgiveness because I was afraid the other person would never forgive me and would no longer like me. But, as a Christian, I knew I had to admit my guilt and ask forgiveness. Whether or not the other person forgave me was that person's choice.

What a humbling experience that was – not only did the person forgive me, but has continued to love me. That is true Christian love. Jesus said "A new command I give you: Love one another.. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men [and

women] will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." Praise God that God forgives us and still loves us when we admit our mistakes and ask forgiveness. I know the person who forgave me is one of Jesus' disciples. This person loves me, even though I did something that hurt this person.

Have you experienced that sort of Christian love in your life? Have you had to forgive someone or have someone forgive you and experience God's grace, mercy, and love through that experience? That is what Christian love is all about. It is only through reconciliation and God's grace and love that we can "forget what is behind and strain toward what is ahead." We can "press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has This has been

Directions to Trinity will be e-mailed to the community.




What's Become of Your Dying Moment?
