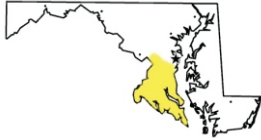

Living Your Beliefs

The Walk to Emmaus is designed to build up the body of Christ as manifested in congregational life and the Christian community. The walk itself educates and gives us common language but why don't we stop there? It is a great experience and could stand alone but living a Christian life is a journey. A journey where we grow in our faith in an intentional way and that is where reunion groups play an important role.

The reunion group format is prescribed and the service sheet (provided on the walk and available at gatherings) is the model. It is geared for one hour and, according to the Emmaus manual, should be followed. By using the service sheet, all reunion groups worldwide follow the same pattern.

There is a written prayer to open and a prayer of thanksgiving to close. This is the order recommended by the international office for Emmaus. 1. Review the service sheet. It covers our continued spirituality, study and action. 2. Answer the question, at what moment this past week did you feel closest to Christ? 3. At what moment did you feel you were responding to God's call to be a disciple? 4. Was your faith tested this week? 5. Talk about a future plan of action. 6. List any reunion group activities planned. 7. Pray for special needs or individuals. 8. Close with prayer.

Emmaus emphasizes that our spiritual life should include morning devotion, prayer life, worship attendance, Communion and spiritual retreat. As for study, reading of the scriptures on a daily basis is a necessity. It also suggests the reading of religious publications and that we should be regular attendees of worship, Bible study, and Sunday School.

You Thought About Teaming, But . . .

Maybe you felt you were too shy, especially to give a talk or to pray out loud. Maybe you felt you were unsure of your abilities. Maybe you felt you wouldn't know anyone. Maybe you felt you didn't have enough knowledge to lead others. Or maybe you felt your spirituality wasn't strong enough.

The purpose of Emmaus is to inspire, challenge, and prepare our local church members for Christian action in our homes, churches, workplaces, and communities. Emmaus is designed to empower and equip Christians to effectively be Christ's hands and feet in the world and to grow in a deeper commitment as disciples of Jesus Christ.

An Emmaus team represents a mixture of members who are one in Christ. As a member of an Emmaus team you assume the identity and role of Christian servants expressing God's love in spirit and deed through your assigned tasks. You work together within the discipline of selfless love celebrating and using the gifts of each member – the Body of Christ.

Team members learn to express their servanthood in ways that glorify Christ and not themselves. Team members learn to develop the quality of hospitality as preparations are made to welcome and accept all pilgrims in fostering a community in which we are all brothers and sisters in Christ. Team members practice agape love as time is spent with God and is open to His will to love with genuine acts of agape. Team members learn insight, good judgment, and understanding to discern the needs and feelings of others. Team members are focused on Jesus and open to new and personal disciplines. Team members are challenged to learn more about Jesus. Team members will have the opportunity to deepen their knowledge, to practice faithfulness, and to develop a closer relationship with Jesus Christ.

The unconditional love of team members and their commitment to Christ will help lead and guide pilgrims toward a deeper love and understanding of Jesus. Team members serve as Jesus would – on the Walk, in our homes, churches, workplaces, and communities.

If you have thought about teaming and would like to experience a deepening commitment as disciples of Jesus Christ, please consider serving on an Emmaus Walk in 2011.

18 Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28 (NIV)



Christian action is our hands and feet in action; living our beliefs. We are commanded to “Go into all the world and preach the Good News,” says the Bible. But where better to start right where you are. The means of grace suggests we should first do no harm, then to do all the good we can and to attend to the ordinances of God. Emmaus urges members to work daily to be better known and loved in their own family, on the job, at their home church, in the Emmaus community, in a reunion group fellowship and in the Christian society as a whole.

The Prayer to the Holy Spirit which opens the model reunion group is a Fourth Century prayer of the Catholic Church and was used as a prayer of celebration and was explained as follows (*selection of the prayer and the following descriptions by Reverend Wood, the first National Director of Emmaus*):

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.

This is biding [*sic*] the Holy Spirit to warm our hearts, like the two disciples on the road to Emmaus had their hearts strangely warmed when Jesus explained the scriptures to them.

Send forth Your Spirit and they shall be created.

This refers to the creative spirit, breath of God, that brooded over the waters in creation. It is the Spirit that God breathed into Adam as the breath of life. For people of God today, it is their continued Walk of salvation.

And you shall renew the face of the earth.

Renewal will take place when God’s Spirit comes upon all of creation and restores God’s created order.

The prayer continues:

O God, who by the light Of the Holy Spirit did instruct the hearts of the faithful.

It is the light of the Holy Spirit, as Jesus was called the Light, that instructs our hearts. Jeremiah talks of this when he gives a message from God that says, ‘I will write it upon their hearts.’ Jesus said that he would send a comforter (the Holy Spirit) to teach us the meaning of everything.

Grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy your consolations.

It is the Holy Spirit that brings us to the moment of sanctification where we enjoy God’s kingdom. It was the hope of every good Hebrew to achieve the status of sitting under his camphor tree while contemplating the scriptures. This was the kingdom for them.

The prayer concludes with:

Through Christ our Lord, Amen.

All New Testament prayers are evoked in the name of Jesus Christ.

There is no doubt, praying this prayer at each reunion group gathering brings those present into a oneness of fellowship.

Healthy reunion groups and good sponsorship are vital to the health of the Emmaus Community and will be a focus of the Southern Maryland Emmaus Community. It is the responsibility of a sponsor to make sure his or her Pilgrim attends the Fourth Day Seminar and to help them get connected to a reunion group. The future success and growth of the church may well depend on the continued establishment of the small group idea. People are more comfortable in small groups. Where a man or woman might feel overwhelmed in a large group and not speak out, the small group tends to allow even the most shy person to take part. This small group concept - people meeting in homes, in work places, in parks, or wher-



ever - during the week to listen to each other and to study and pray together. This is the Fourth Day and should be the most vital aspect of our weekend.

Acts 2:46-47 (NRSV) say "46 Day by day as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, 47 praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved."

Are you in a reunion group? We will be working on some ideas to get new reunion groups started and old groups revitalized. Stay tuned for more information.

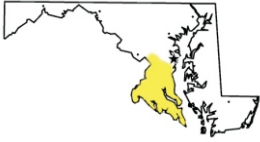
